

he 8th edition of Chandigarh Literature Festival -CLF 2019, organized from November 8 till 10, 2019. brought back the literature vibes to the City. The festival was organized by Adab Foundation in association with Dikshant School and Post Government College for Girls, Sector 11, Chandigarh at the college campus. 

Think Lab Projects

Basics of Electronics

In this section, student learned about the bread-

board, LED, batteries and many components related to electronics. They also made some temporary circuits using breadboards which included lightning of LED, automatic street lights and learned about the series parallel connection. They performed the experiments related to switches to learn how to place the switch in the circuit. The basic part also included the soldering of components on general purpose board. They learned to use soldering iron and understood how to make the permanent circuit boards.

Automatic Bubble Blower

Students made a functioning bubble blower which bubbles

up the soap water after particular intervals. In this project, students used a small propeller, DC motor and servo motors.

LED Cube

In this project students built up a 4*4*4 LED Cube. The lighting patterns in the LED Cube are controlled by arduinouno based on the

program loaded into it.

Hand Gesture Control Robot

Hand gesture recognition robot, follows the

commands made by hand gestures. This robot is made using transmitter circuits, accelerometer sensor and Arduino as the programming platform.

'Otto'- The Robot

Otto walks, dances, makes sounds and avoids obstacles. Otto is a combination of arduino, 3D printable

structure, servo motors and batteries. This project provided students the perfect opportunity to learn robotics and assemble their first robot. They understood how to make logical connection between code and action, and how various components and electronics work.





Think Lab of the school becomes the first NASA STEM Innovation Lab International Outpost

What an incredible and innovative school. Modeling their student

makerspace after NASA's STEM Innovation Lab is inspiring and could serve as a model for other schools around the world.



In today's world, its important that students gain knowledge and skills to solve problems, make sense of information, and know how to gather and evaluate evidence to make decisions.

To build students' skills, content knowledge, and fluency in STEM fields,

students are given an access to quality learning environment at all stages. Dikshant is the first school to have a Planetarium and space center at the campus, thus, allowing students to explore the world of space science to the maximum potential. Students are equipped to develop skills and knowledge in the areas like Telescope Making, Rocketry, Sky Gazing, Designing, Testing, and Launching Satellites.

'Launch into Learning' program for kindergarten and primary section encompasses planetarium shows, space based story sessions, Montessori based space-related activities, board games, artwork, games, competitions and more.

STEM Based Curriculum

Students of the middle and primary school become a part of one of a kind Think Lab which provides widespread access to modern means for invention. The lab is a hub for innovation, invention, tinkering and giving shape to ideas, thus solving global problems using technology and igniting student's entrepreneurial spirit.

As a part of the space program, students launched a 'CanSat' in the year 2017 followed by Balloon Satellite in the year 2019. This is for the first time in the country that school students have carried out a project at this level.













First School in India to develop satellite - Dikshant SAT-1





Dikshant school has become the first school in India to have a team of students design and develop a High Altitude Balloon Satellite named Dikshant SAT-1. The project has been carried out at the Suresh Naik Centre for Excellence in Planetary Science located at the campus.

The satellite has been designed and developed by 12 young scientists of Dikshant studying in Grade IX and above, under the guidance of experts from Smartcircuits Innovation Pvt. Ltd.

The amateur satellite designed by students was launched on 29th March, 2019 at 2:45 am from Bhatinda and retrieved at 6:30 am from Santokpur Village, Kurukshetra. In its 3 hour flight, the satellite reached to an altitude of 1,50,000 feet in the stratosphere and obtained the value of different environmental parameters. The

satellite obtained the video of the whole flight using an on-board action camera. The payload (satellite) was taken to the stratosphere using a helium balloon.


The structure of Dikshant Sat-I was made using a 3D printer. The different sub-systems of DikshantSAT-I include flight board, controllers, sensors, GPS Technology, power subsystem etc. The Airport Authority of India, Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA), Government of India and other government agencies approved the launch of High Altitude Balloon DikshantSAT-I.

In the advanced stage, the school aims for its students to work on cube satellite (small satellite of around 10-centimeter cube only) with a specific mission and launch target into space in collaboration with ISRO. While learning all this, students will get ample opportunities to meet and interact with experts from ISRO and NASA as many exlusive workshops, faculty visits to the campus and audio-video sessions are planned for them in the future.














Teacher Training

Ensuring Smooth Transition of Students

'What helps and hinders a successful transition'

At school, we give a lot of importance to the smooth transition of our students, especially from primary to the middle school. and middle to the high school.



Transition from primary to the middle school.
