9th - 14th December 2019

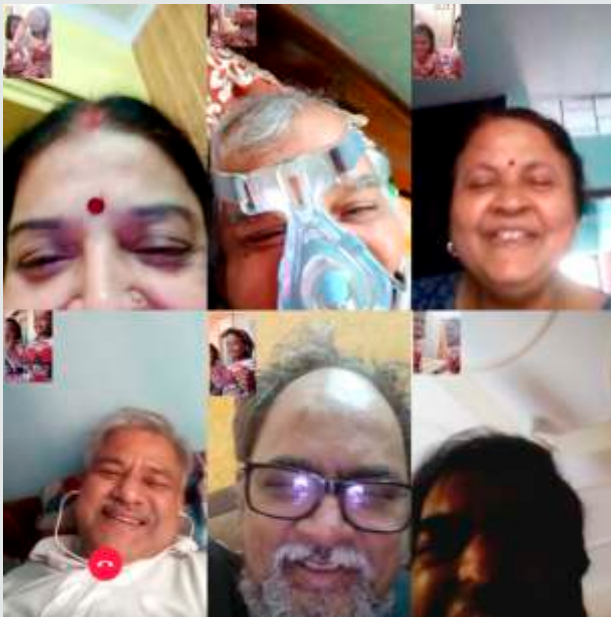
